

LEGAL NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that the County of Steuben and the Department of Public Works will receive sealed bids for labor and material necessary for the Bath Landfill 2009 closure and site improvements:

Contract #1 General Construction:

- Landfill gas collection system construction including eight (8) new landfill extraction wells;
- Construction of approximately 3.8 acres of landfill capping system including surface water drainage system improvements;
- Miscellaneous site work and other related items;
- Replacement valve chamber no. 3 and force main realignment of Turnpike Road;
- Construction of new cleanouts at the Leachate Pretreatment Plant.

Contract documents and drawings may be examined and/or obtained at the office of Barton & Loguidice, P.C. Consulting Engineers, 290 Elwood Davis Road, Liverpool, New York 13088. Cost to obtain documents is fifty dollar (\$50.00) for each set and checks are to be made out to Steuben County. Any mailing cost will be the responsibility of the requester.

Interested parties assume all responsibility that their requests for mailed proposal documents is executed.

Any bidder returning documents in good condition within thirty (30) days following the award of contract or rejection of bids will be refunded cost of documents. Any non-bidder returning documents in good condition will be refunded twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

A pre-bid conference and site walk through will be held at the new Bath Landfill, 5632 Turnpike Road, Bath, N.Y. on Friday, July 10, 2009 at 10:00 A.M. Any questions requiring clarification will be addressed in an addendum.

Bids will be received at Steuben County Purchasing Department, County Office Building, 3 East Pulteney Square, Bath, NY 14810 on or before Tuesday, July 21, 2009 at 1:30 P.M.; at which time bids will be opened and read publicly.

Each bid must be accompanied by security in an amount not less than five percentum (5%) of the bid amount in the form and subject to the conditions provided in the information to bidders. No bidder may withdraw his bid within forty-five (45) days after the actual date of opening.

Attention to bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the contract.

The right is reserved to waive any informalities in the bid and to reject any or all bids.
